WEEK FOUR

DAY 1: GENESIS 3 / MARK 15-16

The coming week will be all about Salvation in our reading plan. Specifically, each day we will take a look at an Old Testament text and see how the prophecies and promises of the Old Testament are fulfilled by the work of Jesus in the New Testament. It's very important that we understand this is one seamless narrative that has always been the same. God wasn't caught by surprise when humans sinned. Jesus was never plan B. Ancient Israel was never offered a different method or path to salvation. The plan of salvation has always been about preparing the world for Jesus, and then spreading the message of what He has done for us.

This will also be the final week of testimonies from church members in our devotional guide. Personal testimonies and stories are an important part of how we share the good news of salvation with the world. So as you read each of these testimonies this week I urge you to take the time and write down your own story. Practice telling it to your friends and family. JOIN THE MISSION by sharing what Jesus has done for you!

DAY 2: JEREMIAH 31 / HEBREWS 8

When my wife and I moved to the area last year, we looked for a church that was not only biblically sound in their teaching but that would give us the opportunity to get involved in study groups, ways to serve, and have a good children's ministry for our son. Wallace has provided us with so many ways to be involved and make connections with others in the church.

DAY 3: ECCLESIATESE 3 / ROMANS 8

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SERMON NOTES

CONNECT DISCUSSION QUESTIONS: SALVATION

- Have you ever been lost? Perhaps you needed directions on how to get somewhere, or maybe you reached a step in a project where you couldn't figure out what to do next. What did that feel like? How did you eventually decide where to go or what to do?
- 2 Tim 3:16 gives us a list of the things Scripture is supposed to guide us in. Teaching, rebuking, correcting, and training in righteousness. What are specific examples of verses that could be used for each of these? Where would you have the opportunity to do each of these things on your campus?
- Scripture was written to a specific audience, by a specific author, at a specific time. Collectively, we call these things context. Why is understanding context so important in how we approach Scripture? What happens when we take Scripture out of context?
- What is your plan for reading Scripture? Do you use a devotional book? Follow a reading log? Share your preferred method of discipline with the class so they can have new ideas! How can we hold each other accountable for being consistent in our Bible reading?

WEEK FIVE

DAY 1: 2 KINGS 20:1-11

This week will focus exclusively on prayer. Each day you will receive prayer points to go through a specific topic. As you prepare to participate in this week, I'd also ask you to consider what methods or disciplines you use to focus and structure your prayer. For most of us, we start to pray, but then we are distracted by a random thought of an upcoming event or task, then before we know it our minds are wandering and we're thinking about chicken nuggets and youtube videos... again. (OK, that's a little specific, so maybe that's just me.)

To overcome the pitfall of our easily distracted minds, we have to treat prayer as a discipline, while also respecting it as a relational act with God Himself. Some people use acronyms to help stay on track, while others prefer a prayer journal or even an accountability partner. Our Bible app has several guided prayer options, there are a number of books written to help you, and if that isn't enough you're always welcome to contact us at the church and ask what you can pray for today. Regardless of which method you choose, I hope you commit yourself to praying daily, knowing God better, and trusting that He listens because He cares.

DAY 2: LUKE 18:1-8

Today we will be praying for some of our mission partners here in the United States. They have dedicated their lives to making sure each and every person across this country has access to a local church and a place to worship. They have made many sacrifices and taken on a multitude of challenges to share the Gospel with the local culture of their new locations. So join me in praying for them and thanking God for their dedication to His Kingdom.

DAY 3: LUKE 11:5-13

For today's prayer time I'd like you to focus on your "one." Now, some of you might read that last sentence and be a little confused. Your "one" is a person that you've specifically selected to pray for, develop a relationship with, and engage with Gospel conversations. Your one is the person you are focused on bringing to Christ. Not as a project, but as a real caring friendship. If you don't have someone you're focused on then begin by praying that God would show you who you should be witnessing to and building that trust with.

- Pray that you would have the opportunity to have regular contact with your one.
- Pray that the Holy Spirit would convict them of their need for Jesus.
- Pray that they would trust you with the hard questions about life.
- Pray that you would have the opportunity to be there for that person in their time of need.
- Pray and ask the Holy Spirit to let your conduct and your care be a powerful witness to them.
- Pray specifically that your one would come to a saving knowledge of Jesus.

DAY 4: PSALM 139

Within our Wallace family of churches we have specific language congregations. The Bible says that we are called to reach "Every tribe, tongue, and nation" so we are making a special effort to preach the Gospel in every language we can. Our language congregations have many unique challenges, so we want to pray for them specifically.

- Pray for Pastor Vitale and Pastor Orlando and they work diligently each week to prepare sermons in their own languages.
- Pray for Iglesia Knox and the Romanian Baptist Congregation as they navigate bridging the gap between different cultures.
- Pray for the people in Knoxville who speak Spanish and Romanian.
 That they would be drawn by the Holy Spirit to be involved in a local church.
- Pray that the members of our language congregations would have opportunities to practice evangelism in their respective languages.

DAY 5: PSALM 136

Today I'm going to ask you to pray for yourself. Sometimes when life gets busy we can fall into a mindless cycle of any habit. Prayer can definitely be one of those habits we do mindlessly. Today I want you to pray for yourself in a way that's entirely different. Before you do that, I want you to do something even more difficult. I want you to take a few minutes of introspection and really reflect on your spiritual condition. Ask the Holy Spirit to convict you about the places where you've just been

going through the motions. Pray that He would send you good friends who are able to call you out when you mess up. Ask God to show you where you've perhaps confused your culture or your preferences with real Christianity. It's only after doing something so difficult that we will be truly ready to hear from God.

- Pray that God would convict you of your sin and remind you of your need for Him.
- Pray that you would see yourself through the eyes of the Holy Spirit.
- Thank God for hearing your prayers and being willing to know you.
- Thank Him for revealing Himself to us so that we can understand even a small portion of His greatness.
- Pray that God would show you where you need to be serving in the church and helping with a specific ministry.
- Thank God for sending Jesus so that you could be saved.

DISCUSSION GUIDE: AUGUST 31, 2025 WEEK FIVE: PRAYER

This week we read a number of passages about prayer, and you were given daily prompts of things to pray through. As you reflect on your week and prepare for our service today, think on how your discipline in prayer changed your day to day perspective. Today's service will be very different as we will be led through numerous topics of guided prayer. It may be uncomfortable for you at first, but leaning into this process will ultimately be very rewarding and help you progress in your understanding and discipline of prayer.
